## 1980s

- James B. Zagel was appointed as the director of Law Enforcement in 1981.
- Laimutis A. Nargelenas was appointed superintendent of the Division of Illinois State Police in 1983.
- Executive Order Number 3 of 1985 by Governor James R. Thompson renamed the Department of Law Enforcement as the Department of State Police and the official name of the Division of Illinois State Police became the Division of State Troopers and the Division of Support Services became the Division of Forensic Services and Identification.
- Jeremy D. Margolis was appointed the first director of the Department of State Police in 1987.
- January 15, 1986, the Department of State Police achieved national prominence, becoming the first State Police organization in the United States to garner accreditation by the Commission of Accreditation of Law Enforcement Agencies. This was repeated in July 1991 and in May 1996.

• In September of 1988, the designation of "Deputy Director" replaced the title of "Superintendent." In addition, the Department of State Police unofficially became known as the Illinois State Police. The change was made to emphasize the Illinois State Police as a single full-service. police agency.
